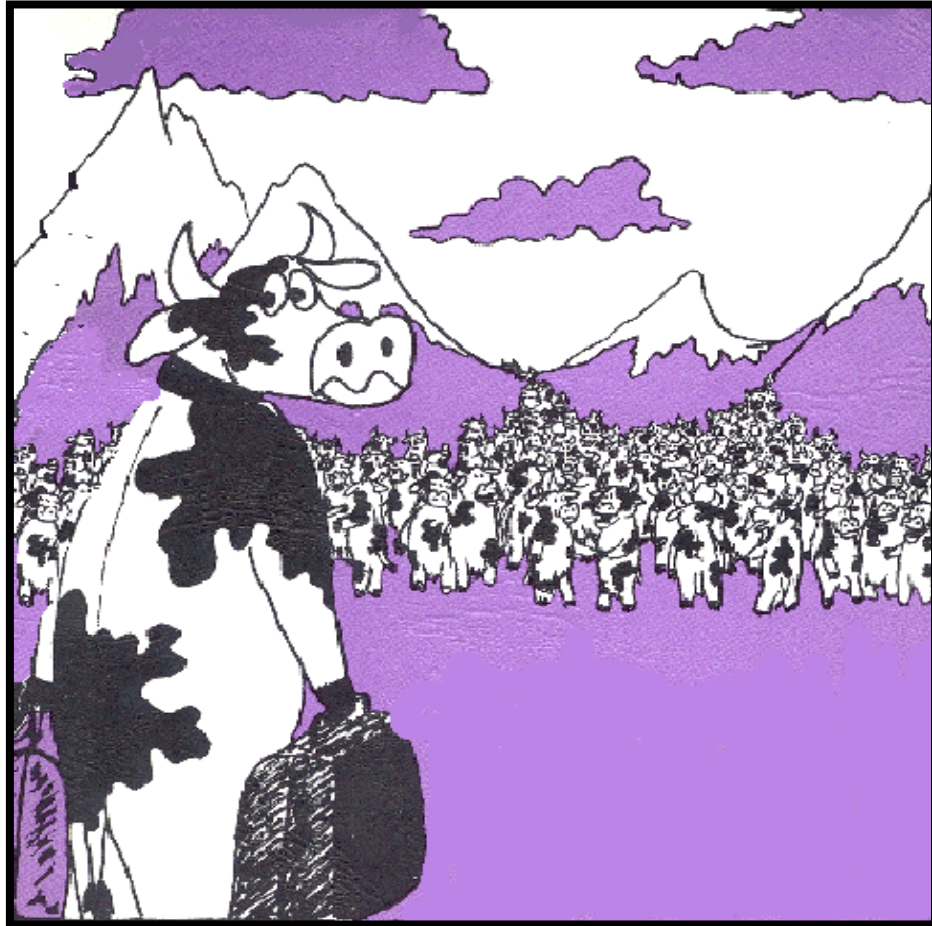

## PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS

- All students are **required** to fill out a student information questionnaire and to take the Quantitative Skills Assessment. You will need a #2 pencil. **No** calculators are allowed at the Quantitative Skills Assessment.
- Placement examinations in the languages are required only of students planning to continue a language they have already begun to learn.
- The exam in chemistry is required of students who wish to place out of Chemistry 151 into Chemistry 153 or 155. Following the exam each student is required to meet with a faculty member.
- The exam in biology is required of students who wish to place out of Biology 101.
- The exam in physics is required of students wishing to place out of Physics 141.
- The exam in music is required of students who wish to place out of Music 103-104.
